PROJECT BACKGROUND

After more than three years of crisis that broke out in March 2011, the humanitarian situation in Syria keeps deteriorating day by day. Almost a quarter of Syria's 22 million people are displaced within the country and 2.2 million have fled to other states leaving behind most of their belongings and living as refugees in precarious conditions, with limited or no access to clean water, food, and shelter. Of the 2.2 million refugees who have fled the war-torn country, more than 1.1 million are children, most under the age of 12. Every day now, up to five thousand people cross the border into neighboring countries such as Egypt, Iraq, Jordan, Lebanon, and Turkey. Newcomers are reported on a daily basis.

Many people, mostly women and children, sought refuge in mosques, schools, sport centers or other public premises. Many more are sheltered in public gardens, parks or makeshift settlements. They try to survive for minimal support and are dependent on only external aid.



The overall death toll has reached more than 134,000 people since the onset of the crisis in March 2011.

200,000 people have been reported as missing. Many people have lost access to almost all basic services from water to health care.

Overall, around 60 percent of the public hospitals have been damaged and more than one-third of all hospitals are out of service leaving wounded Syrians without access to **health care**. More than two thirds of the ambulances in the country have been damaged and many patients face life threatening due to the lack of ambulances. Medical supplies are severely low. Dozens are dying every day due to the lack of proper medical aid.

Moreover **education** was interrupted because people have had to flee either within or out of Syria. One in every five school in Syria is destroyed, damaged or converted into shelters for displaced families – disrupting schooling for hundreds of thousands of children.

The situation in Syria is exacerbated by overall economic decline in the country. The economic crisis led to a drop in the local currency, the Syrian lira, by almost half. The deterioration of the Syrian **economy** becomes clear on the Damascus Stock Market, which witnessed a 54 %. Unemployment is expected to

reach 60 % if the tension continues. With increasingly worsening of the conditions of war, industry was damaged; agriculture has come to a standstill and also bread bakeries where people provide their daily basic need were badly affected. The cost of bread has risen 500% and more than 10 million people are in need of emergency **food** support.

More than 80% of Syrians in need have difficulties accessing humanitarian aid as ongoing violence and restrictions prevent organizations to provide humanitarian aid within Syria. Only some organizations are currently providing emergency assistance either directly or through local partner organizations.

According to the UN; the increasing humanitarian catastrophe is not just an accidental outcome of the crisis—healthcare, infrastructure and personnel are being targeted deliberately. Human rights reports detailing the conditions of the crisis precisely and describing the situation as predictable and preventable. At this place humanitarian assistance increasingly gains in importance as needs are expected to rise continuously within Syria and in host communities that have been affected by the crisis remarkably.





RESPONSE OF IHH-HUMANITARIAN RELIEF FOUNDATION TO THE HUMANITARIAN CRISIS IN SYRIA

In order to help Syrian people who try to cling to life under very difficult circumstances, IHH sent emergency aid teams to the Turkey-Syria border, inside Syria, Jordan and Lebanon. The teams have been conducting several Relief activities at the borders for which the detail is as following;

RELIEF WORKS BY IHH-HUMANITARIAN RELIEF FOUNDATION

I. Humanitarian relief activities in Turkey, Lebanon and Syria:

1. Shelter:


- ✓ Container city, Kilis Province of Turkey
- ✓ Container / tent houses or rooms

2. Food Security:

- ✓ Basic food packages-dry ration
- ✓ Breakfast packets, fruit and vegetable baskets, sweet, water
- ✓ Nutrition packets; baby/child food, high energy biscuits, milk, powder milk
- ✓ Provision of cooked food
- ✓ Setting up bread bakeries
- ✓ Setting up flour mills

3. Health:

- ✓ Provision of medicines and medical equipment
- ✓ Setting up clinics, rehabilitation center, etc.
- ✓ Treatment of patients / injured at private hospitals
- ✓ Supporting hospitals, clinics etc.
- ✓ Provision of ambulances



4. Water, Sanitation and Hygiene:

- ✓ Waste management
- ✓ Container washrooms & toilets
- ✓ Water related activities; water tanks, chlorine tablets
- ✓ Cleaning and hygiene packs
- ✓ Special kit for pregnant ladies

5. Non Food Items

- ✓ Diesel for bakeries
- ✓ Clothes and foot wear
- ✓ Blankets, mats, bed clothes, mattresses, rugs, pillows, pedestal fans, mini refrigerator, kitchen utensils, heaters, water thermoses, trash bins.

6. Education:

- Establishment of school-tent or container
- Provision of school furniture and material
- Provision of school stationery sets to students
- Provision of school books

- > Ordering and receiving the items at the main storage of IHH in Kilis Province of Turkey from where items were dispatched to Syria.

DISTRIBUTION

- Registering and dispatching the items to Syria for distribution
- Distributing in the identified locations and areas

The whole process of the project was monitored by the team of IHH that is based in Kilis Province and involved in the distributions taking place in Syria for Syrian IDP's.


